Submission Guidelines

These are the standards that we ask our authors to adhere to when submitting an article to *Hoplologia* for publication. If any of these guidelines cause you difficulty, please contact us; we will be happy to work with you.

- Articles should be submitted to hoplologia.journal@gmail.com. Please include a brief
 cover note so we know who you are. We accept articles in both English and French.
 There is no minimum length for an article; it should be exactly as long as you need to
 make your argument.
- 2. Please send your paper in .docx (MS Word) or .rtf format. PDFs or other formats will not be accepted. All articles will be copy-edited and formatted in-house to conform to Hoplologia style. Before the article is published, an edited copy will be sent to you for approval. Approval in writing of the final article will constitute permission to publish. If approval in writing is not received, the article will not be published.
- 3. Please cite all your sources as footnotes or endnotes. Hoplologia uses Chicago Style for citation. You, and you alone, are responsible for the accuracy of all information in your notes. Your article cannot be published if material is not sourced to the original scholarship. A general bibliography at the end is not enough; every statement from a source you have consulted must be cited properly and completely. - 4. Please attach separately any images associated with the article, with a clear key in the text to indicate where in the text they should be included, and the same key included in the image title. (i.e. [Fig. 1])
- 5. Please ensure that all images are identified with their sources. If they come from another article or book, they should have a full bibliographical citation. Manuscript images should be identified with the correct library shelf mark and folio number. Photos of artifacts should include both the artifact ID (for example, the museum name, collection, and accession number) and the name of the photographer. Please ensure that you have permission to use the image, and that you indicate this in the image description.
- 6. If your article has been published elsewhere previously, please indicate this, and ensure that there are no restrictions on re-publication.
